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### Well Child Care Guidelines

The Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) developed a set of comprehensive health guidelines for well-child care, known as the "periodicity schedule." It is a schedule of screenings and assessments recommended at each well-child visit from infancy through adolescence. Schedule of Well-Child Visits:

#### Well-Child Visits: Appointments, Immunizations, and More

A well-child exam: Once a year for children ages 13 to 20. The doctor will offer advice about your child's dental health, exercise and physical activity, diet and nutrition, sun exposure, injury and violence prevention and when appropriate, alcohol misuse, sexual behavior, smoking prevention or stopping smoking, substance abuse and suicide ...

Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits (W15, W34, AWC) Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life: Assesses children who turned 15 months old during the measurement year and had 0–6 well-child visits with a primary care physician during their first 15 months of life.

#### Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits - NCQA

Well-child visits provide the opportunity to answer parents' or caregivers' questions and to provide age-appropriate guidance. Car seats should remain rear facing until two years of age or until...

#### Well-Child Visits for Infants and Young Children ...

If possible, child care classes should include the same group each day, and the same child care providers should remain with the same group each day. If your child care program remains open, consider creating a separate classroom or group for the children of healthcare workers and other first responders.

#### Guidance for Child Care Programs that Remain Open | CDC

Children have more well-child visits when they are younger. This is because development is faster during these years. Each visit includes a complete

physical exam. At this exam, the health care provider will check the child's growth and development in order to find or prevent problems. The provider will record your child's height, weight, and other important information.

Assess the emotional status of parents and intrafamilial relationships at each well-child visit. Educate and support siblings and discuss sibling adjustments. Review connection to early-intervention services and their relationship to the strengths and needs of the infant and family at each well-child visit.

Under normal circumstances, in-person well child care (WCC) visits between the provider, child and caregiver remain the standard of care as they facilitate joint discussion and careful physical exam. ### **Well-Child Visits: Parent and Patient Education**

Healthy behaviors are important to instill at a young age, and the well-child visit is a time to review these important behaviors, such as sleep, nutrition, and physical activity. During the teenage years, well-child visits offer adolescents an opportunity to take steps toward independence and responsibility over their own health behaviors.

Well-child care should be consistent with Bright Futures Guidelines for Health Supervision of Infants, Children and Adolescents (4th Edition) and the corresponding Bright Futures/AAP Recommendations for Preventive Pediatric Health Care (Periodicity Schedule).

### **AAP issues guidance to ensure continued care for children ...**

The Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit provides comprehensive and preventive health care services for children under age 21 who are enrolled in Medicaid. EPSDT is key to ensuring that children and adolescents receive appropriate preventive, dental, mental health, and developmental, and specialty services.

### **Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment ...**

These guidelines are designed to assist the pediatrician in caring for the child in whom the diagnosis of Down syndrome has been confirmed by karyotype. Although the pediatrician's initial contact with the child is usually during infancy, occasionally the pregnant woman who has been given the prenatal diagnosis of Down syndrome will be referred for counseling.

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
